



### Folding and Unfolding the Scooter

Note: Before folding or unfolding the scooter, make sure the scooter is powered off, and the kickstand is closed.

- 1. Turn the safety dial near the scooter's joint to either of the two "FOLDING" positions.
- 2. Keeping hands clear of the hinge, press the folding button underneath the safety dial all the way in, and push or pull the scooter until it is fully open or closed, and the mechanism clicks into place.
- 3. Turn the safety dial to the center "RIDING" position to lock the scooter frame and prevent unintentional folding.



#### Installing Handlebars


Screw the included handlebar labeled "R" into the handlebar hole on the right side of the scooter, and the handlebar labeled "L" into the left side.

### Adjusting the Handlebar Controls

You can adjust the electric brake and acceleration controls on the handlebar with the included hex key. Loosen the screws on the underside of the brake and acceleration connectors on the handlebars, adjust to the desired position, and tighten the screws again.

## Charging the Scooter

Undo the rubber cover over the charging port near the top of the handlebars, and plug the pin of the included charging adapter into the charging port. Plug the other end into an electrical outlet.



The LED indicator will *light up RED* while the scooter is charging and turn GREEN when the scooter is fully charged. The scooter may take up to 3 hours to recharge.

- Do not attempt to use the scooter while it is charging or connected to the charger.
- Do not charge immediately after use. Allow the scooter to cool down for an hour before charging it.
- Only charge with the included charging adapter.

#### Powering ON/OFF

Press and hold the [6] button to power the scooter ON or OFF. The display screen will light up when the scooter is powered on, and turn off when the scooter is powered off.

### Accelerating and Braking

To brake, press

Fully charge the scooter, unfold the frame, and push the scooter's kickstand up. Power the scooter ON.

- To accelerate, press down the acceleration control on the riaht side of the handlebars.
- down the red brake control on the left side of the handlebars, or press down the rear brake with your foot. When moving at higher speeds, the rear brake or both brakes must be used.

### Adjusting the Gear

You can adjust the scooter's gear between 1 (the lowest) and 3 (the highest) using the buttons on the side of the display. The current gear will be shown on the right side of the display.

- Press the [◄] button to increase the gear.
- Press the [▶] button to decrease the gear.

### Using the Headlight

Press the headlight button on the front of the scooter to turn the headlight ON or OFF.

### Reading the Display

When the scooter is powered on, press the [也] button to change the information shown on the display.

- [TIME] mode shows the amount of time since powering on.
- [DST] mode shows the distance traveled since powering on. • [ODO] mode shows the total distance traveled by the scooter
- since it was last reset manually.
- [RPM] mode shows the current revolutions per minute (RPM) of the scooter's motor.
- [VOL] mode shows the voltage setting.

#### Adjusting Display Settings

Press and hold the [◀] and [▶] buttons at the same time for 2 seconds to enter Settings mode. The display screen will start blinking "P1."

Press the [◀] and [▶] buttons to adjust the setting according to the instructions below. Then, press the [の] button to switch to the next setting mode.

- In P1 setting mode, select "0" to display the speed in kilometers per hour (Km/h) or select "1" to display the speed in miles per hour (Mp/h).
- In P3 setting mode, select "0" to enable the scooter to accelerate from 0, or select "1" to have the scooter require a kick start before it can accelerate.

After **P9** setting mode, the display will return to **P1**.

Press and hold the [◀] and [▶] buttons for 2 seconds to exit Settings mode at any time.

# Maintenance & Storage

### Cleaning the Scooter

Power the scooter OFF before cleaning, and make sure the charging port is covered by its rubber seal.

The scooter should be cleaned with a damp cloth. If necessary, a stiff brush can be used to remove tougher dirt first.

**Warning**: Do not use alcohol, gas, kerosene or other corrosive and volatile chemical solvents. Do not spray with pressurized water. This can damage the appearance and the internal electronics of the scooter.

#### Maintenance

At regular intervals, check the scooter's bearings, wheels, brake pad, screws and other fasteners for proper fitting and good condition. This will help ensure safe riding.

#### Battery Maintenance

Excessive heat and excessive cold can cause the battery to discharge, and damage battery cells. Do not keep the batteries in temperatures above 122 °F (50 °C) or below 50 °F (10 °C) for a long period of time.

When possible, avoid draining the batteries 100%. It is best to charge the battery while there is still some power remaining. This will extend battery life.

When not in use, store the scooter in a cool, dry place, away from sources of water, humidity, heat, sunlight, wind and fire. Avoid leaving it outdoors, as it is not made for use in wet areas.
