- Do not place or hang heavy objects on the handlebars.

- Only use on a dry, flat surface. Not intended for gravel or dirt roads.
- It is the rider's responsibility to be aware of and comply with all local laws and regulations, and to take care of your own safety and the safety of others.
- Always ride safely and only at a speed that allows you to brake safely at any time.
- If lending the scooter to another person, make sure they use proper protective gear and know how to ride it.

## Battery Safety Information

### Battery Safety Warnings

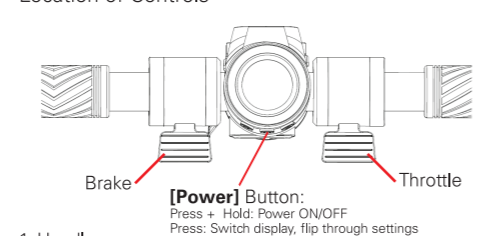

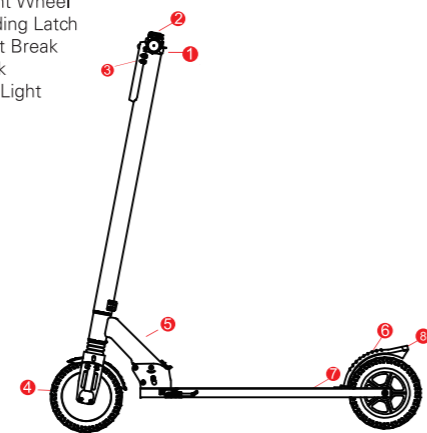

## Getting Started

### Location of Controls



1. Handles
2. Display
3. Headlight
4. Motorized Front Wheel
5. Folding Latch
6. Foot Break
7. Deck
8. Tail Light



### Location of Controls (cont'd)



#### General Display Indicators:

- Speed
- Speed Unit (mph or km/h)
- Battery Level
- Gear Position 1-3:
  - Gear 1: 0-4 mph
  - Gear 2: 1-11 mph
  - Gear 3: 1-16 mph

Press the **LEFT ARROW** and **RIGHT ARROW** buttons to change the gear.

#### Fault Indicators:

- Motor Failure: There is a problem with the motor. Check the motor before using again.
- Control Failure: **There is an internal issue. If this icon appears, immediately stop using the scooter and contact customer service.**
- Brake Failure: There is an issue with the brakes. Check the brakes before using again.
- Low Battery: An icon will light up when the scooter is on low battery with less than 10% charge remaining. Please recharge when this happens.

### Display Indicators & Modes

Different modes and their related settings may be shown on the display as desired. Press the **[Power]** button to switch between modes and different display information.

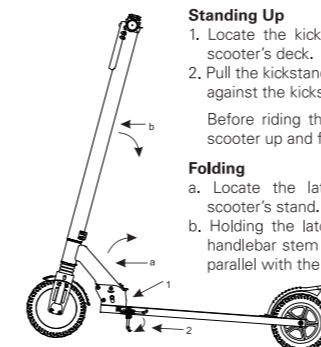
- Distance: This icon shows the distance traveled since the beginning of the trip. To reset, turn the scooter OFF.
- Odometer: This icon shows the distance traveled since last odometer reset.
- Rotation Speed: This icon shows the Revolutions Per Minute (RPM) of the scooter.
- Time: This icon shows the time elapsed since the beginning of the trip. To reset, turn the scooter OFF.
- Voltage: This icon shows current voltage.

### Standing Up and Folding the Scooter

**Note:** Before standing or folding the scooter, make sure the scooter is powered OFF.

- #### Standing Up
1. Locate the kickstand on the side of the scooter's deck.
  2. Pull the kickstand out, and lean the scooter against the kickstand.
- Before riding the scooter again, lean the scooter up and flip the kickstand back in.

- #### Folding
- a. Locate the latch at the base of the scooter's stand.
  - b. Holding the latch open, firmly grasp the handlebar stem and pull it down until it is parallel with the scooter deck.



### Charging the Scooter

1. Remove the cap covering the charging port.
2. Plug the pin of the included charging adapter into the charging port. Plug the other end into an electrical outlet. The LED indicator on the adapter will light up RED while the scooter is charging.
3. The charging cycle is complete when the scooter display indicates a full battery, or when the LED indicator on the adapter turns GREEN when the scooter is fully charged. The scooter may take up to 3 hours to recharge.

#### ⚠ WARNING

- **Do not attempt to use the scooter while it is charging or connected to the charger.**
- Do not charge immediately after use. Allow the scooter to cool down for an hour before charging it.
- Only charge with the included charging adapter.

### Powering ON/OFF

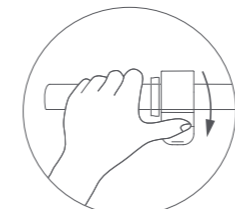
Press and hold the **[Power]** button to power the scooter ON or OFF. The display screen will light up when the scooter is powered on, and turn off when the scooter is powered off.



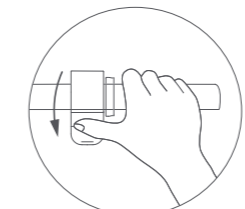
### Accelerating and Braking

Fully charge the scooter, unfold the frame, and push the scooter's kickstand up. Power the scooter ON.

- To accelerate, **first, push off the ground with your foot to start moving.** Once you are moving, you can press down the throttle on the right side of the handlebars.
- To brake, press down the brake control on the left side of the handlebars.

### Riding the Scooter

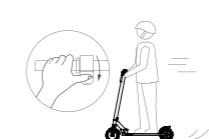
Step 1: Turn on the Scooter, and check the power indicator.



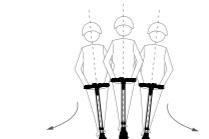
Step 2: Step on the deck with one foot, and slowly kick off the other foot on the ground.



Step 3: When the scooter starts to coast, put both feet on the deck and press the accelerator (Throttle). The accelerator initiates once the coasting speed exceeds 5km/h.



Step 4: Release the accelerator and the kinetic energy recovery system (KERS) initiates automatically to brake slowly, and squeeze the brake lever for a sudden brake.



Step 5: Tilt your body to the steering direction as you turn, and slowly turn the handlebar.

**Note: Mileage can vary depending on the user's weight and road conditions.**

### Adjusting the Gear

You can adjust the scooter's gear between 1 (the lowest) and 3 (the highest) using the buttons on the side of the display. The current gear will be shown on the right side of the display.

- Press the **LEFT ARROW** and **RIGHT ARROW** buttons to adjust the gear.

## Maintenance & Storage

### Cleaning the Scooter

Power the scooter OFF before cleaning, and make sure the charging port is covered by its cap.

The scooter should be cleaned with a damp cloth. If necessary, a stiff brush can be used to remove tougher dirt first.

**Warning:** Do not use alcohol, gas, kerosene or other corrosive and volatile chemical solvents. Do not spray with pressurized water. This can damage the appearance and the internal electronics of the scooter.

### Maintenance

At regular intervals, check the scooter's bearings, wheels, brake pad, screws and other fasteners for proper fitting and good condition. This will help ensure safe riding.

### Battery Maintenance

Excessive heat and excessive cold can cause the battery to discharge, and damage battery cells. Do not keep the batteries in temperatures above 104 °F (40 °C) or below 14 °F (-10 °C) for a long period of time. The ideal temperature is between 68 °F (20 °C) and 86 °F (30 °C).

When possible, avoid draining the batteries 100%. It is best to charge the battery while there is still some power remaining. This will extend battery life.

### Storage

When not in use, store the scooter in a cool, dry place, away from sources of water, humidity, heat, sunlight, wind and fire. Avoid leaving it outdoors, as it is not made for use in wet areas.
