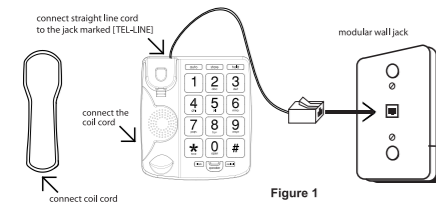


Installation

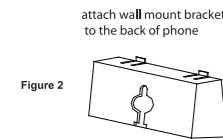
1. Place your telephone on a hard, flat surface.
2. Insert one modular plug of the COIL CORD into the jack of the telephone handset and the other modular plug of the COIL CORD into the jack or the left side of the telephone base (See Figure 1 on the next page).
3. Insert one modular plug of the STRAIGHT LINE CORD into the jack at the back of the telephone labeled [TEL-LINE] and the other modular plug of the STRAIGHT LINE CORD into a modular wall jack.



4. Make sure all plugs snap firmly into place.
5. Pick up the handset and confirm you hear a dial tone.

Wall Mount Installation

1. Make sure you have a wall plate (*not included*) to mount the phone on.
2. Connect the mountable wall bracket to the back of the base (figure 2).
3. Plug the STRAIGHT LINE CORD into a modular wall phone jack.
4. Align the holes on the base with the mounting studs on the wall plate and pull the base down onto the studs until the telephone is secure.
5. Set the hook switch to the wall mount position by pulling it out with your thumb and forefinger, flipping it around and replacing it.



Using the Phone

Phone Operation

- **Making a call:** Lift the handset or press the [Speaker] button, listen for a dial tone, then dial the number you wish to call.
- **Receiving a call:** When the phone rings, lift the handset or press the [Speaker] button.
- **Ending a call:** While a call is active, hang up the handset, or if on speaker, press the [Speaker] button.
- **Handset volume:** Slide the [RECEIVER] switch to [H] for high volume or [L] for low volume.
- **Speaker volume:** Slide the [SPEAKER] switch to [H] for high volume, [M] for medium volume or [L] for low volume.
- **Ringer volume:** Slide the [RINGER] switch to [H] for high volume or [L] for low volume.
- **Tone or Pulse dialing:** Slide the [MODE] switch to [T] for tone dialing or [P] for pulse dialing.
- **Flash:** Press the [Flash] button to activate services such as call waiting or call transfer. You must subscribe to these services from your telephone service provider.
- **Redial:** To redial the last number called, pick up the handset or press the [Speaker] button, then press the [Redial] button.
- **Hold:** To place a call on hold, press the [Hold] button while a call is active, then place the handset on the hook (music will play on both the phone and the other party's line). To release the hold, lift the handset or press the [Speaker] button.

Memory Dialing

This telephone can store up to 10 phone numbers (up to 16 digits), which will remain stored in memory unless you erase or change them by entering other numbers, or unplug your telephone from the wall jack.

To program numbers into memory:

1. Lift the handset or press the [Speaker] button.
2. Press the [Store] button.
3. Enter the phone number you would like to store.
4. Press the [Store] button.
5. Press a number from [0-9] for the memory location where you would like to store the phone number.
6. Hang up the handset or press the [Speaker] button.

To dial out from the memory:

1. Lift the handset and listen for a dial tone.
2. Press the [Auto] button.
3. Press the memory location [0-9] you would like to dial from.
4. The number stored in that location will be dialed automatically.

Troubleshooting Tips

- **No dial tone:** Check to see if your phone is properly connected to the modular wall jack (See the **Installation** section).
- **Phone does not ring:** Make sure the [RINGER] switch (located at the back of the phone) is set to the [L] or [H] position.
- **Handset volume is too low:** Slide the [RECEIVER] switch to the high (H) position.
- **Speaker volume is too low:** Slide the [SPEAKER] switch to the [M] or [H] position.

Product Maintenance

- Follow the guidelines below to properly maintain this product:
- Avoid putting it near heating appliances and devices that generate electrical noise (for example: motors or fluorescent lamps).
 - DO NOT expose to direct sunlight or moisture.
 - Avoid dropping the unit and/or other rough treatment.
 - Clean with a soft cloth.
 - Never use a strong cleaning agent or abrasive powder because this will damage the finish.
 - Retain the original packaging in case you need to ship it at a later date.

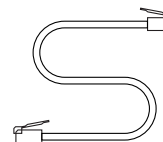

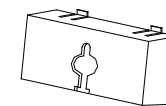

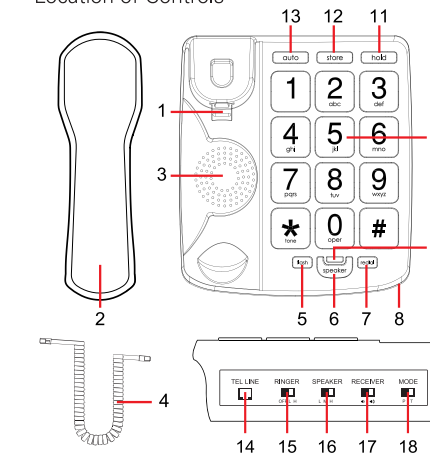
