To adjust playback for your connected HDMI, VGA, or AV device, use the controls on your device or the remote control for that device.

Controlling Playback (USB & Micro SD/TF Card)

Use the following buttons on the remote control to adjust playback while playing media from a USB device or micro SD/TF card:

[₩] | [₩] Buttons: Skip to previous/next file • [**∢**] | [**▶**] Buttons: Fast forward/rewind · [▶II] Button: Pause/resume

While playing a video, press the **[OK]** button to bring up a playback ribbon on screen that can be controlled with the navigation buttons.

To select a specific track or chapter, press the **[Go To]** button followed by the track or chapter number on the number pad.

### Connecting HDMI Devices

- 1. If the projector is ON, power it OFF.
- Insert one of the connectors of the supplied HDMI cable into one of the HDMI inputs on the side of the projector. Insert the other connector into the HDMI ouput of your video-playing device.
- 3. Power the projector back ON, then press the **[Source]** button and select the correct HDMI input using the navigation buttons on the projector or remote control.

#### Connecting VGA Devices

- 1. If the projector is ON, power it OFF.
- Insert one of the connectors of a VGA cable (not included) into the VGA input on the back of the projector. Insert the other connector into the VGA ouput of your video-playing device.
- 3. Power the projector back ON, then press the **[Source]** button and select the VGA input using the navigation buttons on the projector or remote control.

#### Connecting AV Devices

- 1. If the projector is ON, power it OFF.
- In the projector is 614, power it 611.
   Insert the single 3.5mm connector of the included AV cable into the AV input on the side of the projector. Insert the RCA connectors into the inputs on your videoplaying device, matching the colors where applicable.

AV cables are typically color-coded as:

- AV cables are typically color.
  Yellow: Video channel.
  White: Left audio channel.
  Red: Right audio channel.
- 3. Power the projector back ON, then press the **[Source]** button and select the AV input using the navigation buttons on the projector or remote control.

## Connecting USB Devices

- 1. If the projector is ON, power it OFF.
- 2. Insert the connector of your USB device into the USB input on the side of the
- 3. Power the projector back ON, then press the **[Source]** button and select Media Player. From there, find the media you would like to play on the USB device.

# Using a Micro SD/TF Card

- 1. If the projector is ON, power it OFF.
- Insert a micro SD/TF card into the micro SD card slot on the side of the speaker. If the card does not easily slide in, flip it over and try the other direction. When properly inserted, the card will click into place.
- 3. Power the projector back ON, then press the **[Source]** button and select Media Player. From there, find the media you would like to play on the micro SD/TF card.





# **POWERING THE PROJECTOR**

Insert the pin of the supplied power adapter into the DC power input jack on the side of the projector. Plug the adapter into an electrical outlet.

When the adapter is plugged in, the LED indicator on the projector will briefly **turn RED**, then **GREEN**, then **RED** again.



# Powerina ON/OFF

- Press the [O] button on the projector or the remote control to power the projector ON.
- Press the [4] button on the projector or the remote control to power the projector OFF. A message will be displayed, and you must press the [4] button again while the message is displayed to power OFF.

When you are ready to use the projector, remove the lens cap from the lens
